Incoming President's Report

At the AGM on July 5, I was elected president of your association for a two-year term. I hope this role will let me get to know many more of you in the Kahshe Lake and Bass Lake community. The Annual General Meeting attendance burst the



seams of Rockhaven, with many of you standing patiently for the entire meeting. Your board is interested in knowing why so many of you attended. Was it the agenda content? Was it the increased advertising? Or was it simply a fun thing to do on one of the nicest days so far this summer? Let us know so we can do even better next year.

Role of KLRA

I see the KLRA as playing a role in Representation, Communication, Conservation, Recreation and Celebration. Since each of us may interpret these roles differently, I'll expand on each of them from my own perspective over several newsletters, and invite your comments.

In this first column, I'll discuss Representation. The KLRA seeks to influence decisions being made by the councils of the Town of Gravenhurst and the District of Muskoka and, in so doing, represents the KLRA's members. We often comment on very local issues, such as zoning or minor variance applications and in this we are guided by the Kahshe Lake Plan, certainly one of the most important KLRA efforts ever, and one which is now ensconced in the Gravenhurst Official Plan.

We also comment on broader issues that affect us. Recent examples include the Gravenhurst ward review and, at the District level, the debate about reducing debt levels for urban infrastructure through assessing non-urban residents, and in increasing development charges to actual cost. While we may not get everything we want, we seldom come away empty handed. In this effort, we form relationships with key municipal people (elected and employed) and other lake and resident associations.

How It's Done

The work of the KLRA is done by a number of committees, some permanent and some ad hoc. You'll find their reports elsewhere in these newsletters. The Town and District Liaison Committee, chaired by Sandi Follis ably assisted by Rob Abbott is the most active committee in the Representation mission.

Membership

The KLRA needs people in the Kahshe and Bass Lakes community to be members for a couple of important reasons. First, to have credibility in the role of Representation, we need to demonstrate that a significant number of our community members are involved. Second, the money we need to run the KLRA comes from membership fees. My personal thanks to you who are current members. Please ask your neighbours to join the KLRA too – it's cheap, easy, and worthwhile.

Getting Involved

Your board and the committees are made up of a group of hardworking, unpaid people who like to make things better and have fun along the way. We are always looking for help, so please volunteer, whether it be for a committee or to assist at one of the many events around the lakes this year.

Gravenhurst and the District of Muskoka 1. August 2008 - our association and 7 others respresenting most of the lakes in the district, spoke to the District Debt Reduction Initiative at District Council, regarding resistance to the downloading of cost of water & sewage services to non-urban taxpayers. 2. April 2009 - lake associations met with Gravenhurst town council for the annual "meet & greet". Main issue was and continues to be the Ward Review and unfair representation compared to the amount of taxes paid,especially in Morrison (Kahshe Lake) & Muskoka twp.

3. July 21, 2009 - Petitions for Ward Review to revamp distribution of wards was presented to Town Council by our president, Greig Holder and Lola Bratty of the Greater Gravenhurst Ratepayers Association. 579 names were presented, an overwhelming number since we only needed 120 names to force the Town to review their former stand. The Town now has 90 days in which to react and hopefully solve the imbalance of the wards. (See <u>Update</u> below)

4. This past month District Council voted in favor of increasing development charges to 13% every year for a 5 yr.period, which is an increase from 10%. This should help with the district's debt reduction initiative. The increase is for both residential & commercial development.

The Town has asked us to remind everyone that they **must** have a building permit for any project to be undertaken.

On Monday July the 21st, Lola Bratty, Chair of the Greater Gravenhurst Ratepayers' Association, and I had an interesting evening presenting the Ward Review Petition** to the Gravenhurst Town Council at their meeting in Severn Bridge. The petition held 579 signatures, more than four times the number required to trigger the review. 114 of these signatures came from KLRA members, collected primarily at the AGM. Thank you.

Mayor Klinck said he has already had several meetings with staff to get this review under way. After the meeting I spoke with some of the councillors who had previously voted against the review They accepted the voice of the people and will, I think, get engaged. Although this is not an earth-shattering issue, it still needed attention, and hopefully they will now get it done and move on. by Greig Holder

Membership (Rob Abbott)- Only 181 members paid up for 2009/10 out of 800 potential members from Kahshe and Bass Lakes. We have 300 e-mail addresses, 54 of whom have requested the Newsletter via e-mail. PLEASE encourage your neighbours to join the KLRA. The survey mentioned above also invites people to join.

Rock Markers Markers are set out on the May 24 week-end and taken in at Thanksgiving. Not every rock marked. There is a map on website showing placement and stating that "the KLRA is not responsible".

Lake Steward - (Herb Grossman) the water tested when the ice goes out. Testing is done in May and June for turbidity twice a month. MNR will not be doing Benthic Monitoring it this year. KLRA no longer does coliform testing. Howard Mandel will probably be the new Lake Steward. Clint thanked Herb for performing these duties.

The MNR has no funds for the pickerel regeneration project. The "unique" pickerel (Walleye) at the east end of the Lake are not unique after all. There have been changes in habitat in the spawning grounds and land owners are urged to clean up these areas. Some members present indicated that the pickerel were plentiful in other parts of the Lake.

The Craft Show (Judy Ring) August 2. Proceeds will go to a camp on Sparrow Lake for handicapped children. Last year \$4,600 shared between two local Women's Institutes. Judy still needs volunteers, vendors and items for a silent auction.

Worship Services to be held at 10 a.m. Sunday through July and August except for Craft Show day.

Healing Waters of Kahshe Lake - Volume I and II available from Dennes and the Gravenhurst Library. Volume III has only a few stories so far, posted on the website, which also has the Lake Plan on it, other documents of interest, and the Members Forum. 306 people registered this year. New Business:

Judy Ring reported that she is on the Town Accessibility Committee. Ramps may soon be needed for people to access boats. Let her know of any need and suggestions.

Mike Bradley asked if anyone knew about the lots being severed and a road being built from Mt. Mary to the O'Brien's house. The Board was not aware of this. Mike also thanked people for their support re his cottage fire, and warned members to check their insurance policies re value vs replacement cost. People with HRVs should check the make - some from LifeBreath and Fenmore have been recalled. Also, if you notice lights dimming too frequently, unrelated to usage, check with Hydro.

Rockhaven Henry Kowalewski (Water Access Committee) reported that a meeting was held last September with the Rings to discuss Rockhaven's future. The Town recognizes the importance of docking and parking for water access people. A committee is being formed to discuss Rockhaven and anyone can participate. The HRLR portable water pumps may still exist. They were given to the members who had them on their property. The liability issue is huge; therefore, the KLRA did not take responsibility for them. The Fire Marshall does not want people depending on this kind of assistance Motion to Adjourn at 12:15 p.m.

When Ron Post and Carrie Marriott picked up the keys to their new life at the Orillia office of their lawyer this past Victoria Day weekend, little did they know what lay ahead. They weren't back at their cottage and home on Tranquility Bay on Riley Lake for more than ten minutes before Ron decided they should go and hammer a lock onto their new purchase. But when they pulled into the parking lot at the intersection of Muskoka Rd. 6 and Riley Lake Rd., there were 25 carloads of friends there to greet the new owners of the **Summerland General Store.**



And the welcome hasn't stopped. One local resident slipped them \$50 for their start up, another donated boxes of chocolate bars, and someone else grabbed caseloads of pop on sale in Gravenhurst - and refused to be reimbursed. One Kahshe Lake denizen leaned over the counter to give Carrie a big hug; carloads of cottagers have honked and given them the thumbs up as they pass. But more often, they hit the brakes and come into the freshly-painted store (still sky-blue) to ask tentatively: "Are you really open?" To which this couple, in life as well as in business, assure them that yes, they really are open and that yes, after six years of being shut

The shelves are stocked with groceries and all manner of things you need at a cottage but have forgotten in the city. The penny candy counter is back (only it's more like a nickel candy now); the ice cream bar serves up Kawartha Dairy ice cream (the best in the province) and the pizza oven is fired up and ready for orders. (Carrie suggest cottagers phone in their orders – **687 7776** – then swing by to pick them up. Think about it -- Friday nights at the cottage will never be the same!

And there's more good news: Ryde's community computers will be moving into the store, meaning that cottagers and residents will have internet access from there for a small fee.

The dayshift cook at the Northland Motel and Restaurant for 20 years, Carrie, 47, is setting up a lunch counter to serve up light meals and breakfasts. Ron, 58, is a skilled window and screen repairman who's been living in the area since 1990 when he sold a couple of successful businesses he owned in Mississauga.

He describes himself as retired and insists he bought the business for Carrie. "Hey, had to do something to get her a job," he says. But he's joking. He's the one who has stocked the back of the store with basic camping equipment, tire repair kits tools and equipment for plumbing, electrical work and general cottage repair, with food, water, ice, antihistamines, aspirins and first aid kits and propane refills.

And he's the one who is working on getting back some gas pumps for the snowmobilers. Come the fall, he'll be offering boat storage in a secure compound. "We have one and half acres here; gotta use them," he says.



They are open seven days a week and intend stay open year round to serve the community.

The Story of ITLDU

by Dorothy Reid In 1921 my parents bought 98 acres bordering on

Kilworthy Road and Highway 11 and farmed it for two years at which time my mother



went back to My grandparents in front of the farm, Toronto and the farm was turned over to my grandparents Harriet and Fred James. It was agreed that we children would spend every summer at the farm. When my grandparents died, my parents razed the farmhouse and had a small house built on



the site. With the lumber from the farmhouse, two of my brothers built a summer place which they named ITLDU. Another brother put a cottage slightly to the north and one of my sisters built a home facing Kilworthy Road. When my parents died, my other sister had my parents' home and we all

enjoyed the property for many years.

However, the powers that be decided that they wanted our much-loved property for the overpass on Highway 11. They not only put a ramp east and west but also north and south leaving much of the

land useless. ITLDU was demolished, but eventually, one brother put a cottage on land facing Kilworthy Road. My other brother



has my parents' house on Highway 11 with the ITLDU sign still on the gate, and next door my sister-in-law maintains RZLDU2. My brother

"Music on the Barge" Celebrates 50th Anniversary

This year marks the Fiftieth Anniversary of the visit of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth and Prince Philip to Gull Lake Rotary Park and the completion of the construction of the "Barge" in Gull Lake Rotary Park. The "Barge" was designed by Stanley White Jr., and was financed through the combined efforts of the Lions Club, the Rotary Club, the Board of Trade, the municipality of The Town of Gravenhurst and generous donations from citizens. Mr. Harry Schofield was the contractor for the fiberglass superstructure. At a cost of approximately fourteen thousand dollars, the Barge was completed by July 4th, 1959.

The first official performance was held on that day on the occasion of the visit of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth and Prince Philip.

Music on the Barge will commence its 2009 season on Sunday, June 21st with the Muskoka Concert Band and The Muskoka Big Band. During this opening concert the 50th Anniversary celebrations will be recognized. All levels of Government have been invited to the opening concert along with their family representatives who've played an important part in the history of the "Barge". A special "Barge" pin recognizing the 50th Anniversary is presently being designed by Penny Varney.

The Gravenhurst BIA will be co-sponsoring a portable "Barge" chair complete with a "Barge" monogram and carrying bag. These will be produced locally at Muskoka Bay Clothing. Local talented artist Nancy Hunter has prepared the artwork for both projects.

The special 50th Anniversary items will be available at "Barge" concerts throughout the season. There will also be a couple of additional surprise special guests appearing at the "Barge" during this special Anniversary season.



Sun Fish: 7 1/2 inches caught by Carter Deforest




The winners of the fishing derby are all able to keep their trophies for two weeks and then the trophies will be returned to Denne's Marina to have the winners names engraved on them.

The KLRA web site at <u>www.kahshelake.ca</u> contains a volume of information of interest to KLRA members and other people in the area. The home page has links to the **Kahshe Lake Plan** including thirteen detailed maps of the lake (including the one above). This page also bears links to reports and photos of lake events such as the regatta and the picnic.

A very important link on the home page is to the **Discussion Forum**. Go to the bottom of the home page and click on "<u>Discussion Forum</u>". The Forum is updated regularly with information about upcoming events such as the KLRA AGM, the Craft Show, the Barn Dances, the Housey's Rapids Picnic, the Fishing Derby and the Regatta.

The Forum provides the opportunity for registered members to post messages. Although only current members of the KLRA are registered, anyone can see and read the messages that are there.
