“Watt’s Up” is divided into 5 zones placed around a house
full of electrical appliances. To make them function,
electricity has to be produced by visitors:

- muscle energy with dynamo bicycles
- wind energy with two wind fans and one wind turbine
- solar energy with the sun lamp and its solar panel
- hydroelectric energy with a hydroelectric dam

The fifth zone deals with energy consumption including:

- a computer station to calculate one’s ecological footprint
- a wheel game about the energy used to produce a winter jacket
- a puzzle game with six actions to reduce energy consumption
