


The annual Ice-Out contest is set to begin next month. Watch our Facebook page, Twitter and website for details.

INMEMORIAM

Mary (Lindner) Ashbury 1921-2017

Mary passed away peacefully at the age of 96 in Peterborough after a brief illness on October 27, 2017. There wasn't a summer in her life that she didn't spend at least some time at Kahshe Lake from 1922 including the summer of 2017. Her grandfather purchased Erin Island (renamed by the family as Algonac) in 1907. Mary spent time each summer at the cottage initially with her brothers and cousins on Algonac. Mary would recount stories of rowing back and forth to Algonac from Mrs. Klueys', now Rockhaven Inn, before the



introduction of outboard motors. In 1946, she married Ivan Ashbury and introduced him to Kahshe Lake. Ivan and Mary soon built a cabin (which eventually expanded as their family grew) on the northern tip of Lindhill Island. It was just across the channel from Algonac. In the 1950's, Gordon Hill arrived during the week to bring ice for the icebox before propane and eventually electricity arrived on the island. Mary stayed with their children, Ted and Trish, at the cottage from July 1st to Labour Day every summer, sleeping with a baseball bat under her bed to ward off "varmints" so that the kids could spend the summer swimming, water skiing, and eventually working at Rockhaven Inn. Ivan would join them when he could on weekends and on holidays. Trips to Dennes' to get groceries and the "Toronto Star" were a daily adventure.

Mary's happiest moments were spent at Kahshe with Ivan, her children, and eventually, her grandchildren. It was her favourite place in the world. She spent her time at Kahshe developing her passion for art and crafts – painting innumerable landscapes of the Lake, creating traditional hooked rugs and making tile tables among the other crafts that populated the cottage. She and Ivan loved to renovate and build indoor and outdoor creations that made the cottage unique. In the 1970's, they moved from Lindhill Island back to Algonac and put their talents to use renovating the old cottage. Mary and Ivan enjoyed their friendships at Kahshe, particularly the group that started the Sunday morning church services held at Rockhaven Inn. The Lake has lost one of its "old stones" but she won't be forgotten.

Irene Barker (1928-2017)

Keith and Irene have savoured their beautiful view of Kahshe Lake from the cottage on Sam Cook Road since 1970. They spent summers with their four children (David, Karen, Janice, Andrew) enjoying outdoor activities, water sports, and fishing. As the family grew to include fourteen grandchildren and twenty great-grandchildren, they acquired the adjacent cottage property (1990) where Irene found Kahshe Lake to be the perfect place to connect with family. She always had a basket of yarn to crochet into an afghan, and plenty of ice cream to dish out when Keith blew the mid-afternoon whistle. One of Irene's favourite cottage outings was a long, slow pontoon boat ride around Kahshe's many bays and islands.

Volunteers and donations are always welcomed and appreciated.



Winter Cottaging, by Nancy Howchin

Fond memories of winter visits to our NKLR cottage in the late 80's and early 90's

Of course no ploughing would have been done before our arrival, so our family of four would face a





summer. For water, my mom brought snow-filled buckets inside to melt for washing dishes and cleaning. Our great luxury was a styrofoam rescue ring placed over the outhouse toilet seat to reduce the cold. Our family would cross-country ski, build an ice rink, toboggan, and have outdoor fires. Great times! There is one story when my sister's family spent a winter weekend at my grandmother's lake-access cottage. They awoke one Sunday morning to find the entire lake was a slippery, frozen ice rink! After

improvising ice shoes with old bits of wood and nails, they made the four mile trek back across the lake, although it would have been faster on skates.

I love the idea of cottagers visiting in winter. We can have all the comforts in summer, but winter strips it down to the bare bones. It will quickly teach you new skills and a better understanding of the Muskoka northern climate. It's amazing to think about the expertise that Canada's First Nations needed to survive: hunting, gathering, storing, and of course, staying warm!

If you're feeling brave enough to start a new winter tradition, here is a short list of essential supplies. Enjoy! electric blanket lots of buckets large antique wood toboggan warm moccasins

small heaters flash light (+ batteries) strong plastic bags
