

Water Access Committee Report by Henry Kowalewski

The Water Access Committee has been involved with a number of issues related to water access cottagers on the lake over the last year. Instead of trying to fix everything, we have decided to address a smaller number of issues and bring these up with the Town of Gravenhurst and/or the Region of Muskoka. These include waste management issues, new overhead lighting at the public docks, new(er) dock hardware, and public dock maintenance.



In regards to waste management, a number of issues are being addressed. The first and most obvious is the unsightly mess that tends to occur during the cottage season at one or more of the garbage/recycling drop off points. These include Rockhaven, Denne's and the South End. The Region is responsible for cleanup and pickup at these locations, not the property owner. Cottagers are responsible for using the bins properly and that includes **not** leaving large items on the property. It has also been noticed that contractors in the area are using the dumpsters illegally for getting rid of their building trash. If anyone sees a

contractor doing this, please let us know. If you feel that there are not enough bins at any of the locations, the Region will be made aware of this and it should be quickly corrected.

Andrew Guthrie is now our contact at the Region responsible for waste management issues. He is also looking at the possibility of moving dumpsters to make them less visually apparent but many factors, such as truck access, must be considered before this can be done. The bins at the south end were moved down the road last year and this seems to have made things better in that location. The possibility of putting bins at the Fire Hall on Kilworthy Road is being considered, but no final decisions have been made. More pickup times were implemented last year and extra bins were added which improved things, especially at Rockhaven.


The Town has told us that we are to be part of the programme to install new overhead public dock lighting at Rockhaven, Denne's and the South end, and we patiently await installation of those fixtures.



The Town has been reminded on several occasions about the lack of maintenance of the public docks. They acknowledge this and tell us that we are part of a programme to improve dock quality, etc. Dock hardware is an issue and unfortunately, the

KLRA may have to pay for better quality dock tie-ups etc. Hardware that the Town has provided is not of the highest quality.

We have asked the Town to improve conditions at the public boat ramps with more gravel, levelling, etc. In a



word, it's complicated because of the number of approvals required to do anything under the water. We will update the members if and when any improvements occur.

Here's hoping that we have a short, warm winter and can look forward to putting our boats and docks in for an early cottage opening.

Grass Pickerel on Kahshe, by George Lindsay

Last summer, Donna Sutherland noticed someone 'netting' fish near her place. When she investigated, she found out that Julia Colm, at the time a graduate student at Queen's University, was doing research about fish on our lake. While her thesis has not yet been published and we can't yet share those results, Julia is now an Aquatic Biologist employed by Fisheries and Oceans Canada and early in August 2016 she came back to Kahshe looking for Grass Pickerel.

Part of the pike family, the Grass Pickerel's status in Ontario is 'of Special Concern', meaning that the species lives in the wild in Ontario, is not threatened nor endangered, but may become threatened or endangered due to a combination of biological characteristics and identified threats. Julia and her team were successful in finding Grass Pickerel on Kahshe, which is uncommon in Muskoka. They tend to prefer low gradient streams, although they do like the shallow, weedy bays of lakes too. Grass Pickerel were found in the Kahshe River, and quite a few in Bass Lake.

Grass Pickerel have very specific habitat needs, and although they like weeds, they have to be a certain type of weeds; more like Largemouth Bass habitat as opposed to Walleye habitat, and they like muddy/muck bottoms instead of rock/cobble.

While on Kahshe, they met several fishermen, who were very helpful (as are all Kahshe folks) in pointing out where the weedy bays were on the lake.

Here are three photos Julia offered to help distinguish a Grass Pickerel from a Northern Pike.



The 1st photo is of an adult Grass Pickerel, whose average size is about 19cm in Ontario. The Canadian record is a 32.8cm fish that actually came from Kahshe.




The 2nd photo is of a 'young-of-the-year' Northern Pike, who reach about the same size as an adult Grass Pickerel in their 1st year.

Thanks to Julia for sharing this information and photos with us.

The final photo is of both species, the Grass Pickerel on the bottom left and the Northern Pike on the top right. Grass Pickerel have a fully scaled cheek and gill cover (opercula), Northern Pike have a fully scaled cheek but only half scaled gill cover (notice no scales on the purpely-iridescent patch of the Northern Pike). The snout of the Northern Pike is also slightly longer, and they lose the black teardrop after the first few years, but the Grass Pickerel keeps this as adults.
