#### Introduction

As part of the Love Your Lake Shoreline Assessment program, a values survey was conducted to gauge the opinions of residents on Bass Lake about major concerns and important qualities of Bass Lake. This report summarizes the preliminary results of the survey which was distributed to 34 shoreline property owners or residents on Bass Lake, 4 of whom provided their responses. The results of each survey were compiled in an excel file which were then analyzed by Watersheds Canada and the Canadian Wildlife Federation in the form of tables and histograms. Conclusions were made based on trends among the responses, and identification of potential stewardship initiatives to help the Kahshe Lake Ratepayers' Association focus their stewardship efforts.

#### Results

## Property Ownership

Of the 4 respondents to the values survey, 3 (75%) identified themselves as seasonal residents, and 1 (25%) identified themselves as permanent residents, as shown below.


Of the 3 seasonal residents, 2 (66%) said they do not plan to become permanent residents, and 1 (33%) said they do plan to become permanent residents.

Time spent on Bass Lake varied from 1 year to as many as 57 years, with 28.75 years as the average number of years spent on the lake.

#### Recreation

The top three recreational activities identified by the 4 survey respondents included Canoeing or Kayaking, Swimming, and Power Boating. The least popular recreational activities included ATVing, Jet Skiing, Snowmobiling, Ice Fishing, Mountain Biking,

Camping, Sailing, Hunting, Ice Skating, and Scuba Diving.

## Values Associated with Personal Enjoyment




Figure 1. Distribution of Bass Lake shoreline property owner responses regarding elements affecting enjoyment of the lake.

The most important elements of Bass Lake, valued for their impact on personal enjoyment of the lake, included Water Quality, Scenery/View, and Dark Skies (No Light Pollution). Figure 1 shows the distribution of ranked values for each element, in order of the most valuable to least valuable element. The survey asked respondents to rate each activity from 1 to 5 with 5 being extremely important and 1 being not important.

# Top Issues Facing Bass Lake




Figure 2. Distribution of shoreline property owner responses identifying the top issues faced by Bass Lake.

The most frequently identified issue facing Bass Lake provided by the 4 respondents was Water Quality, followed by Water Levels, Shoreline Development, and Faulty or Poorly Maintained Septics. Table 2 summarizes the number and percentage of respondents that identified each issue as a top concern. Figure 2 shows the distribution of shoreline property owner responses regarding the issues facing Bass Lake.

## Actions to Undertake to benefit Bass Lake and the Community

The most frequently identified actions shoreline property owners on Bass Lake believe would benefit the lake and the community include:

- Undertake a lake management plan
- Engage in a septic re-inspection program
- Limit boat wakes near shore

Table 3 summarizes the number of times and percentage of responses that each action was identified as beneficial to the lake and the community.




Figure 3. Ranking of top actions needed to benefit Bass Lake.

## Perceived Water Quality Concerns

Of the 4 survey respondents, 3 (75%) perceive water quality to be good, and 1 (25%) perceive water quality to be poor.




Figure 4. Ranking of top water quality concerns.

The top concerns expressed about water quality were Algae/aquatic vegetation, Smell, Clarity, and Bacteria. Table 4 summarizes the number and percentage of responses identifying each water quality concern for Bass Lake. Figure 4 below shows the distribution of shoreline property owner responses regarding water quality concerns on Bass Lake.

# Shoreline Property Owner Interest in Stewardship Information and Activities

Of the 4 respondents, 3 (75%) said they were interested to learn more about their activities and how it affects water quality, wildlife habitat, and the overall health of the lake. When asked whether they would be interested in participating in stewardship activities around the lake, 1 respondent (25%) answered "yes".

### Discussion

On the completed surveys, Water Quality and Water Levels were the most important factors affecting the property owners' enjoyment of the lake with 3 (75%) respondents rating each as a top issue facing the lake and their lake use. As well, 100% of respondents placed Algae/aquatic vegetation as one of their top concerns regarding the health of Bass Lake.

When shoreline property owners were asked to identify the top actions that would benefit their lake, Engage in a septic re-inspection program, Undertake a lake management plan, and Limit boat wakes near shore were the most recommended. Kahshe Lake Ratepayers' Association may consider gathering more information on this as well as getting opinions from more residents on Bass Lake.

Residents rate Swimming, Power Boating, and Canoeing or Kayaking as the top activities on Bass Lake with 100% saying they participated in these lake activities. This result provides an opportunity to Kahshe Lake Ratepayers' Association for more stewardship initiatives by showing that the suitability of the environment for recreational activities could be jeopardized if current issues are not addressed.

When asked about overall water quality, residents seem to agree that they have good water quality. 3 respondents said the water quality was "good".

## Conclusion

The main concern seems to be Algae/aquatic vegetation among lake residents. 75% of respondents rated Bass Lake as having good water quality. Other main concerns were Water Levels, and Water Quality.

On Bass Lake 75% of respondents are willing to learn more about how to help the health of the lake. There appears to be opportunity for planning and stewardship programs to help restore and preserve Bass Lake.

By working together with all interest groups and landowners in a coordinated effort, the protection of Bass Lake can be improved.
